The Belize Foundation for Research and Environmental Education (BFREE) was founded in 1995 with the primary mission of preserving the tropical rainforests of Belize. To achieve this goal, BFREE acquired 1,153 acres of forested land and established a privately protected area and biological field station strategically located at the foothills of the Maya Mountains. The BFREE property borders four national parks and is at the gateway to the Bladen Nature Reserve, the crown jewel of Belize's protected areas system. Working with multiple stakeholders, BFREE conducts conservation activities throughout Belize and acts as a steward of threatened wildlands and wildlife while inspiring others to participate in the preservation and restoration of the country's precious natural resources for future generations.
